As someone who is passionate about the intersection of history and creativity, I was drawn to the Exhibitions Project Manager position at the Field Museum. I was fortunate enough to intern with your institution during the summer of 2023 in the Exhibitions department under Marie Georg, and I appreciate the museum's commitment to preserving and presenting the past in new and interesting ways. I always keep an eye out for any open positions in the hope that I can continue to work with and learn from the Field Museum.

The position of Exhibitions Project Manager requires someone who is detail-oriented, passionate about working with people, and knowledgeable about different cultures and time periods.
